Color Explosion from Marsha Randles

The block assignment for August is Split Complementary. Are you asking yourself, what in the world is Split Complementary? OK. Complementary means colors across from each other on the color wheel. The split part is that you chose the analogous colors on each side of one of the complementary colors, and then use the other complementary color. Example: I am choosing red and green as my complementary colors. Now I am going to make green the color to choose the analogous colors. This means that I don't use green-green but I use yellow greens and blue greens. The block will be made up of yellow greens and blue greens and red. Remember, you can use colors that have white added to make them lighter, or gray added to give them a dusty look, or black to make them darker. Also, you can use prints that have other colors in them but the fabric needs to 'read' the colors you have chosen for your Split Complementary.

Have fun and enjoy making the block this month!
