Role of Quilts in History

- I recently read an interesting article by Julie Taboh in the Voice of American English News. She wrote about a new exhibit in Washington D.C., titled "Workt by Hand; Hidden Labor and Historical Quilts." Thirty-five historical quilts on loan from the Brooklyn Museum's collection are being displayed at the National Museum of Women in the Arts.
- Associate curator Virginia Treanor was quoted as saying, "Learning needlework for much of American history was an absolute necessity for women. You had to learn how to use a needle and thread, you had to know how to make clothes, how to stitch bedclothes...so it was really a large part of the education for girls and women for a large part of American history. One purpose of the exhibit is to dispel common myths associated with the quilts and the women who made them. One of those myths is that early colonial women were patching together quilts from scraps or clothing and other materials to stay warm in the winters, and this really was not the case. The quilts that we have today from this earlier period really demonstrate that women who did make quilts were from a very, very high social class because they had to be able to afford the material. Material, at that point, was imported, usually from England, so it was expensive. The women also had to have the time to complete the quilts."
- Ms. Taboh pointed out that for many women, quilt-making was an enjoyable activity and an essential form of artistic expression. The 1970s were the first time that quilts were displayed in museums and recognized as art.
