A Letter from the President



2016 Interest Survey Results

Feedback from guild members is very important for planning meaningful meetings and programs. A short survey was developed and distributed at the August 2016 meeting. The survey asked questions about specific interests for programs and speakers. It then raised questions about acceptable fees for classes and speakers. The responses have been tabulated. There were a total of 52 survey forms returned. Members did not respond to all questions, so numbers will not add up.

Piece work topped the first choice tally; Color theory was the top second choice selected, and How to Plan Layout was the top third choice.

Eighty-six percent of respondents indicated that they would be willing to pay \$30 for an all-day class. Ninety-six percent of respondents indicated that they would be willing to pay \$5 for a lecture.

Clearly the interests of guild members vary widely, but the responses will be very helpful to the Program Committee as it plans future special activities.
