* Block of the Month Color Challenge: Using the same 12.5 x 12.5 (finished) block pattern (the pattern can be found on the website) each month will have a different color challenge. Every month at the guild meeting, a color will be revealed and the block will be due at the following month's meeting. (March's color is black and white). The interpretation of the block, in color, is up to the individual (shading shown on the pattern is only to illustrate the different blocks requites in the final piece) and appliqué blocks may be substituted for any of the block units but the colors MUST follow the challenge made at each meeting. Blocks will be kept for an undetermined final project or projects (depending on how many blocks are received. If you have any questions please contact Kathy Haver or Marsha Randles. This program will run through January 2018.

*Hatchet Block: Cindy Huffman will bring a pattern for the Hatchet block in March, members will make a baby quilt and bring the final quilt to the July meeting. Quilts will be donated to charity.
