Meet the Member: Marilyn Welling



I grew up in Luckey, Ohio, graduated from Eastwood in 1971, and married my soul-mate, Keith, when I was 20 years old. We purchased a house in Woodville and lived there for 27 years and then moved to the Welling family farm outside Gibsonburg in 2000, being the 4th generation to own the property. We have two wonderful sons, David and Michael. David lives in Toledo with his soul-mate Patty and Mike lives in Woodville. No grandchildren...yet!

Growing up I was a Girl Scout and a member of 4-H where I made the traditional tea towel and apron. In high school I took Home Ec and learned about sewing. I made a lot of my clothes in high school but had one problem. I loved the pattern. I loved the fabric. But when I put the two together they were awful. I lost a lot of confidence in myself at this time so I started buying store-bought clothes.

Fast forward to 1996. My in-laws were celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary and I wanted to make a quilt for them. I called my big sis, Janette Willman, and proceeded to put a quilt together. It was a big hit and it was my first quilt. Having made one quilt I wanted more and my second was an English paper piecing wall hanging. I was hooked!
