What makes a quilt a quilt? According to most shows we enter, a quilt is three layers, attached in some way. When you make a donation quilt, keep this in mind. We ask all members to make two donation quilts each year. These do not have to be elaborate, quilt show winners. They can simply be a top and a backing, and something in the middle. Take two pieces of fabric, add batting or a piece of flannel, sew them together pillowcase style, flip and press. Or back a panel print with fleece. These can be simply quilted, machine tacked, or tied. The baby quilts we donate to Children's Resource Center in the summer are used as 'floor' quilts, so the babies have a clean, safe place to play and sleep. They can be lightweight throws...it is summer in Ohio, after all. Dig through your stash, find those colorful kids prints you bought for the baby who is

now in college. (Or as one of our members put it recently..."last century's fabric.") Sew a quick, cozy baby quilt, and we will see you at the August meeting. Stay cool, and dry! Cindy
